Mikael's terms and conditions of publication

Mikael – Finnish Journal of Translation and Interpreting Studies is an open access journal published by The Finnish Association of Translators and Interpreters (SKTL). The publication of an article in the journal is subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The author agrees that the publisher has the right to publish the article in an electronic, Open Access format. The article will be published at the publisher's expense, and the publisher has the right to edit the manuscript as required by the publication process, provided that the content of the text is not altered.
- 2. The author is responsible for the content of the article and for its originality, and warrants that the article has neither been published elsewhere nor submitted for publication elsewhere. The author warrants that he or she has the copyright to the article and to the figures, tables and other material included in it and warrants that permission from all third-party holders to republish such material has been obtained where necessary. After the publication, the author will retain the copyright to the article.
- 3. The author agrees that no royalties or remuneration will be paid for publishing the article.
- 4. The publisher has the right to make changes to the usability or availability of the publication at any time for any cause without liability to the author.
- 5. The articles published in *Mikael* can be used in accordance with the CC-BY-NC license. The metadata of the articles can be used in accordance with the CC0 license. The authors retain the right to upload and re-distribute their published articles through other open access channels and repositories as long as the original journal is duly credited. Similarly, anyone can openly copy, distribute and display the articles published in *Mikael* as long as this happens for noncommercial purposes, and the original author and journal are given due credit.
- 6. If the article was prepared jointly with other authors, the corresponding author warrants that he or she has been authorized to agree to these terms and conditions on the other authors' behalf and that the authors have jointly agreed on the order of their names in the article.
- 7. Possible disputes concerning these terms and conditions will be resolved primarily by negotiation. Any legal proceedings concerning the agreement shall be maintained in the District Court of Helsinki (Helsingin käräjäoikeus).
