

Accessions to the Zoological Museum of the Finnish Museum of Natural History, University of Helsinki in 2009

The number of accessions amounted to 895 vertebrates, 49,855 insects, and 9,714 samples of other invertebrates. The systematic groups represented are listed below and some noteworthy records for Finland are reported. *Bembidion obtusum* Serv. and *Polydrusus formosus* (Mayer) (Insecta: Coleoptera), *Culicoides dewulfi* (Goetgh.) (Insecta: Diptera), and *Thanatus arcticus* Thorell and *Palliduphantes insignis* (O. P.-Cambr.) (Araneida) are reported as new to Finland.

Vertebrates Division

The vertebrate collections have increased by 895 samples distributed as follows: 467 mammals, 418 birds, 9 reptiles and 1 amphibian.

Among specimens of faunistic interest the following may be mentioned:

Mammalia

Pipistrellus nathusii (Keyserling & Blasius) from Ab:Dragsfjärd, Örö, 17.11.2008, leg. Jaakko Kullberg. This was the fourth museum sample of this rare southern species from Finland.

Alces alces (Linnaeus) from Lkk: Kittilä, Kiitotala, Lehtoniemi, about 12.8.2008, antler found under a peat layer at a depth of 3,4 m, leg. Agnico-Eagle Mines Limited. The subfossil was aged to 8,900 years BP, that is the Ancylus period.

Elephantidae Gray, 2 specimens with the following data: 1. N: Suomusjärvi, humerus found in a potato field in 1960, leg. Marja Simonsuuri. Based on diatom and pollen analysis, the bone is an ancient one and was placed in a secondary deposit (pers. comm. Mikael Fortelius). 2. N: Sipoo, Suomenlahti, SW side of Krokholmen, summer 2005, ulna found during the dredging of the sea lane to Vuosaari port, leg. the crew of the dredger Cornelius. Based on diatom analysis it was aged to

Eemian interglacial, about 120,000 years BP. These two were the 10th and 11th “Mammoth”-finds from Finland.

Aves

Phylloscopus collybita collybita (Vieillot) Al: Lemland, Lågskär, 23.5.2006, leg. Sampo Laukkonen, found dead in a bird-net. The first accepted record of the subspecies from Finland.

One large donation is to be mentioned in particular: Olavi Stenman donated his collection of 230 excellently prepared and well documented skulls of the Ringed Seal *Pusa hispida* (Schreber). These skulls date from the 1970s till 1990s, a period of great difficulties and slow recovery for the Baltic seal populations.

Division of Entomology

The entomological collections have received 49,855 specimens representing various insect orders as follows:

The largest accessions were the Lepidoptera collections, donated by Jari Flinck (about 7,500 exx.) and Olli Lehto (about 4,500 exx.), both mainly collected outside Finland, and some 5,000 specimens of Chironomidae, collected by Olli Paasivirta in Lapland.

The museum staff has continued to add to the collections in connection with their scientific work. This material includes, besides Finnish materials, about 5,000 specimens of Lepidoptera from New Zealand and about 6,000 specimens of Lepidoptera from Lesbos (Greece), collected by L. Kaila and J. Kullberg, and some 3,000 specimens

of insects (mainly Coleoptera), collected by O. Biström on Lesbos.
